## **Burden Museum & Gardens: A Family's Gift**

You may have enjoyed visiting the Burden Museum & Gardens in Baton Rouge. Now you can learn how they came to be. The story is told in a new documentary, **Burden Museum & Gardens: A Family's Gift** premiering on Monday, August 29th at 7 p.m. and repeating at 11 p.m.

In the 1800s the Burden family lived on hundreds of acres of woodland and farmland in Baton Rouge that one day would be gifted by their heirs to LSU to become the Burden Museum & Gardens. Their legacy ensures the protection and care of the flora and fauna, the lush landscapes, and the rich agricultural heritage. A [visit today](#) is an opportunity to learn about the lifestyle of an earlier time and take part in activities, such as: the Children's Garden; the Trees and Trails program which now includes The Mosaic Boardwalk at Black Swamp; Master Gardener courses; and the Junior Docent Program.
